SERVICES

The county initiates some services and others are programs run in cooperation with the state and federal government.

1. Public Safety

Sheriff is in charge of the jail, road patrol, 911 calls, criminal arrests, and dog laws. EMA provides services related to natural and man made disasters.

2. Infrastructure

Engineer maintains roads, bridges, culverts, sewer and drainage.

3. Courts

3 judges operate criminal, probate, juvenile, municipal, civil courts, plus record marriage license.

4. Auditor/Treasurer

Oversee the county's fiscal health, collect tax, chief investment officer, monitor real estate assessments, issues dog tags

5. Public Health

Disease prevention, immunization, restaurant inspection, building codes, birth and death certificates, and promotes a healthy life style.

6. Human Services.

Assist low income family & children, oversee food stamps, medicaid, child support, child abuse & neglect, foster care, and child placement .

7. Economic Development

A catalyst to create jobs, promote business growth, and develop workforce training.

8. Elections

Oversees all federal, state and county elections, including school and township elections

9. Recorder

Records and maintains all real estate transactions, deeds, liens, mortgages, and subdivision plats.

10. Clerk of Courts

Maintains records of all court proceedings, autopsy reports, passports, and vehicle titles.

11. Extension /Soil and Water

Provides agriculture - 4H - consumer science information. Promotes conservation practices in soil, water, and environmental management.

12. Veterans Service

Provide vets. with emergency financial needs. Also assists vets. and their families who are entitled to DIC and all VA benefits.
